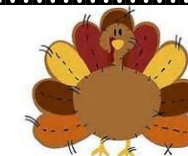

Happy Thanksgiving

On November 11, 1620, about 102 settlers aboard the famous *Mayflower* arrived in the New World. Within five months, after a hard winter, over half their number had died of starvation, cold, and disease. But these "pilgrims" still could find reasons to be thankful in spite of such hardship!

Today, Thanksgiving brings to mind warm memories of turkey and dressing, pumpkin pie, family togetherness. Thanksgiving is a time when we pause to remember how blessed we are as well as to reflect on how we are using those blessings.

We really *ought* to make every day a day of thanksgiving. The Bible says, "in everything give thanks, for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you (1 Thess 5:18)." I honestly don't believe that the pilgrims concentrated all their thankfulness into one single day, and neither should we! *God's word teaches we would be much more joyful people if we would simply learn the habit of being grateful people.* Let's strive to make every day of our lives a day of thanksgiving. Here are some practical ideas:

Every night, write down five specific blessings you experienced that day. Blessings will flood into our minds when we really stop and think about it!

Once a week, take the time to write a note of gratitude and encouragement to someone who has blessed you with their life. You'll be overwhelmed by the results!

Every time you pray, listen to what you are really saying to God. Are my prayers concerned mostly with saying, "I want, I want, I want," or, "Thank You, Thank You, Thank You?"

Each day, make it a point to tell just one person in your life something you admire and appreciate about them. Be specific, and DO NOT BE NEGATIVE.

Read the Bible daily, keep a journal in which you write down each promise or blessing God has given. While reading over the blessings be sure and prayerfully thank Him for each one.

No matter what your circumstances, never forget that everyone has three basic blessings: Life (Acts 17:28), Opportunity (Galatians 6:10), and the Lord (Titus 2:11). With these three blessings, we all can be grateful.

These are but a few practical ways to develop the habit of gratitude in your life. So many of us grumble and complain when in reality God wants us to rejoice in Him (Phil 4:4)! If you are skeptical, *I dare you to try the activities listed above for just a month!* You will find you have drawn nearer to God (James 4:8), and that your joy in Him is fuller. Let's have thanksgiving every day!

Elders' Comments

Do you ever feel downhearted and discouraged? Most of us do. Yes, even Christians often become discouraged. Confidence and hope are weakened, and sometimes lost, when we become discouraged. How can one overcome discouragement? Think more positively (Phil.4:8). Thoughts must be controlled by thinking better. of others and circumstances. Pray more earnestly (Phil.4:6,7) Work harder (1Cor.15:58) Very often. working to improve what discourages us can bring about better results.

Jesus Took after His Father– and His Mother

We may say of a baby, “He looks like his mother.” As he gets a little older and develops a personality, we may say, “He took after his father.” Jesus was God’s Son (divine) (Jn. 3:16), yet He was Mary’s Son (human) (Matt. 1:18-25). So, which was it—human or divine? Did Jesus take after His Father or His mother? Both! A baby is completely his father’s son and, completely his mother’s son. We can see traits of both in any child. And we see some of both His Father and, mother in Jesus. Jesus often showed His “human side” of compassion, physical weakness, and spiritual struggle (Lk. 4:1-11). Jesus also showed His “divine side” of miraculous power, remarkable wisdom, and insight into the secrets of men’s hearts (cf. Jn. 2:25). Consider a few examples:

- It was the mother’s Son who was so tired that He slept in the back of a boat during a storm (Matt.8:24), but it was the Father’ Son who awoke to say, “Peace be still,” and the wind hushed at the sound of His voice (8:26).
- It was the mother’s Son who sat wearied on a well in Sychar (Jn.4:6), but it was the Father’s Son who offered the Samaritan woman the water of life (4:14) and knew all her personal history (4:17).
- It was the mother’s Son who wept for Lazarus’ grieving sisters (Jn. 11:35), but it was the Father’s Son who said, “Roll away the stone” and cried, “Lazarus come forth” (11:39.43). As Man, he sympathizes with us in our sorrows and separations, and as God, He sends them away.
- It was the mother’s Son who cried in the garden, ”Let this cup of suffering pass from me” (Matt. 26:39a), but it was the Father’s son who said, “Not my will but Thine be done” (26:39b).
- It was the mother’s Son who cried out, “I thirst” from the cross (Jn. 19:28), but it was the Father’s Son who said, “Father, forgive them they know not what they do” (Lk. 23:34).
- It was the mother’s Son whose lifeless body was buried in a tomb on Friday (Matt. 27:60), but it was the Father’s Son who rose from the grave on Sunday morning (Matt. 28:6).
- It is the mother’s son who, because he lived among us, knows our human weaknesses (Heb. 4:15), but is the Father’s Son who stands at God’s Throne interceding for us (1 Tim. 2:5). Jesus was God- He knows our needs, Jesus was man– He understands our feelings.
