It may be just a phone call or an invitation to share with another. Loneliness is often at it's worse during the holiday season. Maybe we can help.

DOING WHAT IS RIGHT

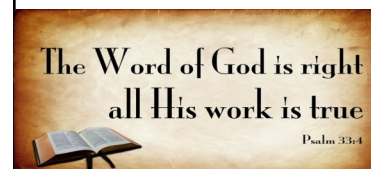
You may have had the opportunity to meet and hear brother Gus Nichols preach the gospel before his death in the early seventies. Many interesting stories have been told about his life of service in the kingdom of God. One thing he did when counseling people for any reason was to ask them three questions before beginning the counseling session. (1) Do you really want to do what is right? (2) Are you ready for the Bible to tell you what is right? (3) Are you ready to do what the Bible says right now? If they answered “No” to any one of the questions, he would then tell them that he could not help them. It would be good if these questions were seriously considered by anyone, whether being counseled, or in simply dealing with life in general. Let’s look at these questions.

Do you really want to do what is right? We must earnestly desire to do what is right at all times. Whether in the home, in the work place, in business dealings, in social relations, wherever and whenever, the right thing is always the best. Other people should have confidence in us that we will want to do what is right in any given situation. Paul expressed such confidence in Philemon when his runaway slave, Onesimus, was sent back to him as a brother in Christ. *“Having confidence in your obedience, I write to you, knowing that you will do even more than I say.” (Phile.21)* In marital conflicts both parties must desire to do what is right. Personal misunderstandings can be overcome when we want to do right. Just think of congregational divisions that have occurred through the years which could have been avoided if the brethren involved had showed a greater desire to do what is right.

Are you ready for the Bible to tell you what is right? There is no better standard for what is right than the word of God. The Bible deals with principles of right and wrong that can be used in every part of life. What others tell us may not be right. Our own feelings and opinions may or may not be right. But when we are receptive and submissive to the instructions given in the Bible, we can know that it is right and cannot be wrong. In Psalm 119:128 we read these words, *“Therefore all your precepts concerning all things I consider to be right; I hate every false way.”* The prophet wrote, *“O Lord, I know the way of man is not in himself. It is not in man who walks to direct his own steps.”* (Jer. 10:23)

Are you willing to do what the Bible says right now? Counseling is for the purpose of correcting and improving difficult situations. But what purpose does good counseling serve if it is not heeded? Procrastination in doing what is right leads to more wrong and possibly to the point when correction would not be possible. Many marriages ending in divorce could have been saved had the parties involved started earlier to work out their differences. Dealing with conflicts in the church when they first arise can prevent greater problems later on. The sooner we do what the Bible says in any situation the better it will be. *“Behold, now is the accepted time; now is the day of salvation.”* (II Cor. 6:2)
